



Worksheet 4:

Can You Teach It Clearly?

Purpose:

To help you practise explaining something clearly enough that anyone could understand it – even someone younger than you!
This challenge builds your ability to organise your thoughts, speak with clarity, and test how well you truly understand something.

The Task:

Your job is to teach someone how to make a paper aeroplane ✂️
Sounds easy, right?

But there's a catch – you must write and explain each step clearly enough that a younger child (around 6 years old) could follow your instructions without seeing you do it first.

This means:

- You'll need to think carefully about every fold and direction.
- You'll need to check that your words are easy to understand.
- You'll also need to imagine what might confuse someone who's never done it before.

Instructions:

1. Don't rush – imagine you're the teacher.
2. Write each step slowly and clearly below.
3. After you've written it, ask someone else (a sibling, friend, or parent) to follow your instructions exactly as written.
4. Watch how they do it – and note where they got stuck or confused.
5. Rewrite those steps to make them clearer.
